


Varlet aims to be a global reference name

The word varlet has its origins in the 15th century and was used to refer to a person acting as an attendant. The meaning of this no longer used word felt appropriate for the ambitious products that were created, as "bag hanger" simply does not reflect all of the effort and detail that has been put into these products.

Despite being trademarked, the aspiration is for variet to be used as the global reference name for this category of accessory furniture.

Varlets are standing bag hangers that are placed next to the table in restaurants to hold guests' bags so that they may eat more comfortably.

THE DESIGNERS VARLET ONE CREATOR

What does it mean to you to be a product designer?

A creative person specialized in devising objects, taking into consideration their functionality, aesthetics and viable production.

Your studio is located in a town called Banyoles, surrounded by nature and close to Barcelona, how does this influence your work?

It has a direct influence because I believe the environment plays a big role in daily life. It is essential for me to have time to work but also to enjoy my family and friends. When I lived in Barcelona I lacked time due to long journeys to go from one place to another and the accumulation of people. Compared to the stress of a city, in towns everything flows differently, quietly but without pause. From Banyoles I am an hour away from Barcelona as well as the ski slops and I can be on the beach in 30 minutes, ideal!

What led you to open offices in Tokyo and Edinburgh and what do you admire about these two cultures and their approach to design?

I have always been attracted by Japanese culture and a few years ago, during the design week in Tokyo, Ritsuko Mizuno approached me and proposed to be our representative in Japan. I immediately accepted and we have been working together since 2012.

We have worked for multinationals such as Ricoh but also with small artisan masters. There is an exceptional variety of companies in Japan and they work at a great level. Next August we will be presenting a chair that we have designed for Idée, which is a Muji company.

Recently we have opened our Edinburgh office to be able to better support our ongoing projects there and strengthen our presence in the UK, a very powerful design market in my opinion.

Who do you admire in your field?

I especially admire the design pioneers who worked with very few resources compared to nowadays and many times developed products of much higher quality.

We are currently living in a time where too many products are being produced and where too often price is more important than design and quality. This is not the way forward. We should be mindful of what we produce, and ask ourselves if that object adds value to the market.

5. Congratulations for all the awards that you have won over the years, how did it feel to win the first one and what do they mean to you?

Awards are always subjective, and therefore, are somewhat relative, but I have to confess that a recognition of one's work always encourages and reconfirms that we are working in the right direction.

6. What was the inspiration behind the varlet you have designed?

One is pure geometry, it is a game of basics. Tangent lines, parallels and concentricities. An example that a design that looks purely aesthetic can at the same time be functional.

7. What materials do you like working with?

I do not have favorite materials. I believe that every object requires a specific material and this makes our profession open and fun. I am constantly learning.

8. In your opinion, what is the future of product production. Local versus global?

We have been talking about additive manufacturing for years now and I think we can confidently say that this is the present already. I believe in manufacturing locally but with the advantages of modern technology. Design and manufacturing have evolved tremendously in the last 15 years, but probably the interaction between users and objects have done so even more.

It seems that everything needs to be connected (Internet of Things), but I do not think this is the right path. Designers will be key in creating unplugged objects that allow for peaceful environments.

9. You have worked with amazing talented people, any anecdote that you can share?

Working with the Roca brothers form El Celler de Can Roca, (several times awarded "Best Restaurant in the World" by Restaurant Magazine) I was fortunate to enjoy some of the most creative experiences by always pushing every project to the limit, including in areas that were traditionally quite static.

One particular experience that I remember is creating a dessert with Jordi Roca that was meant to explode inside a glass cupola that was placed on the table. Once it exploded the dinner had to turn zthe cupola upside down and eat the food attached to it. Luckily, the other two brothers stopped the project on time.







Supporting talented up and coming designers

Elisava is considered one of Spain's best design schools and attracts students from all over the world. The partnership with Elisava allows us to support talented up and coming designers and support our city of Barcelona in a meaningful way.

The collaboration has been an enriching experience and the result is the beautiful minimalistic Varlet Baston designed by Ana Zueras (Master in Furniture Design) which looks elegant but at the same time effortlessly blends into different interiors.











VARLET ONE IN BRUSHED BRASS AND BLACK MARQUINA MARBLE








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

This elegant varlet stands out for its architectural aesthetics and intelligent design that allows for the semi circles to rotate horizontally to adapt to different types of bags, as well as to hang one or more bags comfortably and securely.

For bags with handles, once the bag is hung in the lower semicircle, then it is covered with the top semicircle, creating a complete circle and at the same time protecting the bag from possible theft.

The second position is thought for clutches (small handbags without handles) for which there was not a solution other than putting them on the lap or on the table while eating.


